Kayak frame

Wooden frames such as this, covered with sea mammal skins, created a light, durable maneuverable craft in which Eskimo hunters could travel long distances in pursuit of sea mammals such as walrus and seal, a staple in their diet. The single hatch in this craft is for the accommodation of a single Eskimo hunter. Through various techniques of sealing the water-proof skin parka of the hunter about this hatch the craft could be made virtually water-proof. Larger open skin boats (umiaks) allowed a number of people to undertake relatively long sea voyages (i.e. between Siberia and the Alaskan mainland). The use of metal in the construction and repair of this particular specimen is due to European contact.

One of the bone pieces ends with a curved pointed part, the other with a smooth cylindrical part and a small bone stick with a cleaved end at the very end. This bone stick holds a leather string, perhaps a harpoon line) in place. The leather string ends with a bone piece that could hold a metal arrowhead. Leather strings are wrapped around the wooden pole at both ends to fasten the bone pieces. A small bone/ivory piece is tied to the middle of the wooden shaft, probably an animal head, but no inlaid eyes.

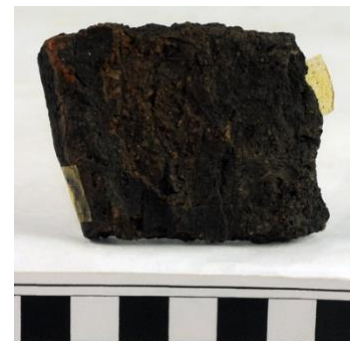
